





J-JAMBOREE HAUL-OUT PROCEDURE

HAUL OUT ORDER

The order of haul-out will be as shown in the table below. However, if a boat is not ready for haul-out in its proper sequence, the haul-out team will order the next boat which is ready for haul-out to move to the haul-out point in order to keep the flow moving. We have about 12 boats to haul-out so your preparation is the key to doing it quickly. If you are #1, #2, or #3 in sequence, it will be important, once you dock, to quickly send a crew member (who can skillfully back the vehicle and trailer) to Sawyer's parking lot to pick it up. The vehicle for the first boat to be hauled out should proceed directly to the haul-out point. All other boats should queue up at the ice rink (4) waiting for instructions from a member of the haul-out team who will be in radio contact with the haul-out point.

PREPARATION FOR HAUL-OUT

We will pull the mast out at the first haul-out station. Please have your sails, boom, and mast instruments removed, forestay and backstay detached, and all shrouds with the exception of the uppers removed. The uppers should be only hand tight so we can quickly loosen them to remove the mast. If you wish to leave your stern pulpit support for your mast near the haul-out area on Sunday morning with the name of your boat on it, that may save some time.

TRAILER POSITIONING

Members of the haul-out team will quide you in positioning your trailer.

AFTER YOUR BOAT HAS BEEN LOADED ON YOUR TRAILER

Please move your trailer to the ice-rink parking lot (4) to complete the job of fastening straps etc. so as to make room for the next trailer to back in.
